Meeting Minutes—December Meeting

The monthly membership meeting of the Yellowstone Region SCCA was called to order by Regional Executive Chris Brewer on Tuesday, December 4, 2012, at 6:00 p.m., in the GH&R Law Firm conference room.

Minutes of Previous Meeting: There was no monthly meeting in November.

Treasurer's Report: Secretary/Treasurer J. Reuss reported the current checkbook balance and noted that all bills were current and that he had paid the annual rental fee to Skyview. J. indicated that he had not completed the recap of expenses related to the timing trailer refurbishing.

Old Business: Dean Johnson reported that primarily due to a lack of manpower, the Region would not be conducting an event as part of the Montana Challenge in Helena. It was noted that there will be 6 or 7 Solo events at the Emergency Services Facility in Helena this upcoming year, with most of them being 2-day events.

New Business: Nominations and voting for the Region's Most Improved Driver of the Year and Spirit of the Sport awards took place. The winners will be announced and awards presented at the year-end party. (Date and time TBA.) The Region received an email from Region 105 (Great Falls), that announced the dates of August 10th and 11th for the 2013 "Top Gun" event. Top Gun will no longer be part of the Montana Challenge. The Region also indicated that it would hold events in Helena on May 18th and 19th (first leg of the Montana Challenge) and September 14th and 15th. It was decided that the January meeting would be held on the second Tuesday of January—the 8th—rather than the evening of the 1st. Last, the 2012 Region officers were reelected for 2013 by acclamation.

A motion was MS&P to adjourn the meeting at approximately 6:30 p.m.

News from the "Front" - by the Roving Regional Reporter

The Region acquired more front-wheel drive members this year than rear-wheel drive, so a recent article in *Grassroots Motorsports* is "must reading" for the neophyte members. Front-wheel drive cars require a very different driving style because the front tires are trying to do several jobs (braking, cornering, and acceleration) at the same time. The article makes the following recommendations: (1) Rotate the car earlier in the corner, so that there is very little steering input when accelerating out of

the turn; (2) trail-braking—decreasing brake pressure as the car nears the apex allows the weight to remain transferred to the front of the car at corner entry, adding grip to the front and rotating the back; (3) increase rear tire pressure decrease rear grip to help the car rotate; (4) add camber plates to allow a minimum of 3 degrees of negative front camber; (5) increase front caster because camber will be further increased with steering angle; (6) anti-roll bars—stiffen the rear and loosen the front only

until you start losing the contact patch in the inside tire; (7) make sure your differential will minimize the amount of inside front wheel spin on cornering, i.e., limited-slip differential; (8) and increase the toe out in the rear to get the rear "loose." With the car loose on corner entry, the driving style becomes "pitch and catch." You can pitch the car into the corner, and as the back end starts to come around, you catch it with the throttle. The benefit is that with the rotation, the car will be pointed down the track awaiting throttle.
