Out of the 5 from 1986 we have 4 charter members, 2 from Billings, 1 from Hardin & 1 from Bozeman, Also several other members that were charter members rejoined in 2000 & 2001.

As you can see we are spread out over several states & even Canada.. We seem to have trouble retaining our membership. Some move away, many burn out from doing the work and not having enough fun, some quit racing for awhile, some quit racing for good. What we really need now is everyone to step forward & become a worker, namely a Safety Steward. If we have more Stewards, then the work load can be spread around and we can have a fuller race schedule. The last two races in Billings were almost canceled due to no Safety Stewart. There are about 30 members in the Billings area, 35 in the Bozeman area & 16 in Idaho. The rest are scattered. However, out of those members around Billings, Bozeman and Idaho we should be able to come up with a 40-50% of people holding a Safety Steward license. We have Jim Arnett and Dale Dinsmore in Billings, Marty Westland in Bozeman and Cal Craner in Idaho Falls as instructors, so we can have Solo Safety Steward Schools in those places. Please let these people know that you would like to be a Safety Steward and help them set up a school. There is an hour long video and you must work two events under supervision to get your license. So get the lead out and get your license so we can help retain the Safety Stewards we now have by helping with the work load.

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
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
