









A few statistics for the 2008 season:

Not including Lewistown, the Region hosted 8 events, up from 6 in 2007 and 6 in 2006. The average number of drivers per event was essentially the same in 2007 and 2008—20 drivers (which was down slightly from an average of 23 drivers per event in 2006). In 2008, the ratio of member drivers v. non-member drivers was almost exactly 50-50.

The Region's cash position improved significantly during 2008, with the bank balance increasing by over one-third.

As indicated in last month's newsletter, memberships were up by nearly 20% in 2008.

Mike Moore won the STX class with his Subaru WRX. Dave Marble finished 5th in a field of 11 cars in the SM class. Randy Roberts took first in class in FSP. Way to go, guys!

There are a number of excellent videos available to "put you in the driver's seat." Make sure that you choose the "watch in high quality setting" and choose the full screen mode. Don't forget to turn up the sound! One of my favorites is the video entitled "Helena Divisionals 2008." The sound is great!

At the National Championships, three Region members from Idaho Falls attended the 4-day event in September at Topeka, Kansas,

Cal Craner drove his 2008 D Stock Chevrolet Cobalt SS to a 14th place finish. Brian Coulson's 2004 B Stock Maxda RX8 finished 16th in class. Last, but not least, Karen Craner's 2004 Formula 125 finished second in her class and was the sole trophy winner for the Yellowstone Region.

Great job, Idaho Falls! Thanks for putting in an appearance for the Yellowstone Region at Nationals! (Perhaps you folks could venture north some weekend next summer and give us some pointers!)
