Meeting of 3-07-01 called to order.



SCCA POINTS FUND FOR SOLO II YELLOWSTONE REGION

FUNDING

Money will come from car registration fees (\$5. per number), entry fee to the points series (\$10.) and from a \$1.00 fee levied on all entrants to Yellowstone region events that are listed as points races.

Money raised by number sales and entry fees to the points series will be equally decided between all major divisions (stock, street prep, prep, mod and street touring/mod). Monies from the \$1.00 fee on entrants will be kept in the division that the car is racing in.

SCORING

All cars will be classed per the SCCA Solo II rule book. In this points series there will be no bumping or moving of cars to make a larger class, however, the points awarded will be higher for a win in a multi-car class.

However, the upshot was that a poll would be taken either on the internet or via the mail to see how the membership at large feels about it. We hope that you all respond with your input. It will involve a small fee to enter and the money will be given back to the winners in prize money or the like. (trophies). We also talked about registering our car numbers for a fee of \$5.00. Again, there was disagreement, some saying why pay for something that is already theirs. It was offered that it is a way to raise some money for the club, and would solidify an attempt to register numbers last year, which basically failed.

We talked about buck runs, & also had some spirited debate on that subject. The seemingly acceptable result of that debate was that these money raising runs are available only to the racers that have registered & participated in the event of the day. It was of considerable importance to have enough people around when it is over to clean up the area and shut down the event. If this does not happen, buck runs may not be possible. Dennis H. felt that it was a good way to raise money, and that the Bozeman group has had

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
