were assigned for upcoming events.




We had a pretty nice turn-out at our first event of the season on the 17th. Lots of first-timers to welcome and I hope we will be seeing them again.



Almost 1/3 of the entrants were "rookies" and all did well in their respective classes. afterfunction was at Godfather's Pizza on 24th street but we had neglected to announce it at the driver's meeting. That won't happen Next, as for again. the "flow of the day", for the newcomers out there, depending on the number of entrants, we may continue the daily schedule without a formal lunch break. Tech inspections and registration starts as early as 8am but is usually really going at 9am. Those who show up late disrupt the event, particularly when only a few hard working people are running the event. I will be discussing the possibility of a policy change, at the next meeting, to disallow registration after 10am on any event day. More on that in the next newsletter.

On Race Day, Remember...

- If there are two rum groups, you are to be working when you aren't running. This is non-negotiable and mandatory. If there are more than two rum groups, you WILL have an assigned time to work. If you don't work, the event is delayed and WILL NOT START until all workers are in place. If you fail to work, you will NOT have times posted as they will be dropped from the computer prior to printing out at the end of the day, PERIOD!

- Watch for workers who may be trying to "flag you off" during your rum. This did happen a few times on Sunday but met with little success. Don't worry, you WILL get to run again. Just drive slowly back to the pits or to start line to see what happened and get directions.

festured Member of the Month: Kurt Schulz

Kurt started his racing career
back in '62, racing a go- kart
when his dad was stationed in
England. His first SCCA event was a
National Road Rally in 1964, racing a
Corvair.

After a stint in Vietnam, Kurt autocrossed a Cortina GT in St. Louis in the 1st Capitol Mustang Club.

After leaving the service, he moved to

Montana. His first Solo II event was in 1972

where he drove a Spitfire. He road-raced from

1987-2001. His favorite car that he drove was

the hot-rodded Formula V (when it worked). He

claims that "driving the V was more fun than sex".

Well, Kurt, Ill leave that one alone. His first

love is still road racing. He says that, while he
enjoys Solo II, autocrossing after road racing is

like "slow dancing with your sister".

I asked Kurt if he lived to be 125, would he still be racing. His answer was, "As long as they have hydrogen powered wheelchairs, I suppose so". I think that means he is hooked. He does say performance driving is "in his blood". He also gives a lot of credit to having a very supportive wife.

He reminds us that Solo II is a great
thing to get young drivers involved in.
Due to the important driving skills and
car control that are learned in
competition, they become better
equipped to avoid accidents on the
street.

His advice to newcomers: "If you think you're fast, you're probably not, so find an

REMINDER:

Nitrous bottles and other
pressurized containers will NOT be
permitted in any vehicle during competition!

It is best to just remove the
bottles while you are at home.

That keeps us all safe and
helps prevent theft.

On Race Day, Remember... (cont)

- Watch out for go karts, their drivers, and children in general. They are small and aren't always easily seen. We make it our policy to have someone walk next to the karts for their protection so, if you see some strange person walking along in staging, try and keep in mind that they are probably "marking" a kart.
- Another reminder about the karts is to extend to them
 the same courtesy as you expect. Just because they are
 smaller and pit in a separate area (mandated for their
 safety), doesn't mean they should be crowded out and
 blocked from pulling into staging line. This was a
 problem at the last event, that it was difficult for
 them to get staged because full sized autos were
 preventing them from lining up. Don't get angry if
 someone stops you from progressing to allow a kart to
 get in. Chances are, that kart was sitting there, ready
 to go and running for quite some time and just prevented
 from staging, long before you arrived at your spot. I
 promise, you will ALL get your turn(s).

-Lastly, only one person should tell you what to do so ignore everyone else. Starter starts, not the guy/gal in the timing trailer and the pit boss directs you in staging, not the starter or anyone else. The starter doesn't clear until OK'd from timing. Too much watching the wrong person was going on at the event and isn't going to be tolerated in the future, for safety's sake.
