June Minutes


The June meeting was called to order by RE Ryan Coler. The minutes were approved as published in Fast Times. The Treasurers report was distributed.

On Race Day, Remember...

- If there are two run groups, you are to be working when you aren't running. This is non-negotiable and mandatory. If there are more than two run groups, you WILL have an assigned time to work. If you don't work, the event is delayed and WILL NOT START until all workers are in place. If you fail to work, you will NOT have times posted as they will be dropped from the computer prior to printing out at the end of the day, PERIOD!
- Watch for workers who may be trying to "flag you off" during your run. This has happened a few times and can happen again so be prepared. Don't worry, you WILL get to run again. Just drive slowly back to the pits or to start line to see what happened and get directions.
- We are getting several karters involved in our events now so some extra precautions when driving are necessary. They sit so low to the ground that its almost impossible to see them. We have implemented a plan to have an adult standing next to the karts in staging so keep your eyes peeled.

 With the new registration cut-off of 9:45, be sure to get to the event site and prepared to register well before that time. If you are late, you will not be able to run in the morning. BRING YOUR DRIVERS LICENSE WITH YOU FOR ENTRY!

Dennis is always around to help out the newcomers to SCCA, too.




