Lockwood-Skyveiw-Eagle


Columbus Airport

There were maybe a dozen. We got the hint. After the course was set up, we all grabbed brooms and got a good work out. Greg Painter then showed up with a blower and eventually walked the whole course with it. The course, by the way, was just about the same as Top Gun, except it was run in reverse, with the necessary changes. Since this was my first time in the area, I can't explain it any further.

The weather was chilly, but the wind wasn't blowing so it was OK. It did feel good to be in the car with the heat on. I remember the last event I was in I just wanted to get out of the car because it was so hot!
